Ever since I met (aged 18) a real-life Franciscan friar (in Tanzania of all places) I've been attracted by the story of St Francis and I've sought out Franciscans to help with my spiritual journey. Their stress on simplicity of living, on humility, love and joy, and on the balance of prayer, study and work, is the kind of thing I need to get back in touch with whenever life gets too busy and fraught. Imagine my delight, therefore, when I discovered that a member of our early morning Sunday congregation was a 'lay' member of the Franciscan community. I was all the more delighted when it turned out that he (Paul Alexander) was also a professional actor who had developed a one-man show about the life of St Francis and that he was willing to give a performance in our parish hall. My joy was complete when he offered to do this for free, so that every penny we take on the door will help raise money for the church.

So let me introduce this extraordinary medieval saint and the man who will bring him to life for us.

St Francis of Assisi

Short of stature, sticking out ears, a straggly beard and as thin as a rake. A quality of inner stillness, fiery, penetrating eyes, with a tangible aura of spirituality. A magnetic personality drawing people from a huge variety of backgrounds. As equally at home with animals as with people, people flocked to hear him speak, to be near him. Enigmatic, illusive, very humble, a friend of beggars, lepers, kings and popes. An outcast to his father but at the end of his life well over 5000 men and women following in his footsteps.

His influence on the 13th century was enormous. His influence today is equally great

acclaimed as the patron saint of the environment and followed by such as Archbishop Desmond Tutu and Lech Walesa of 'Solidarity' fame.

The show will present the ups and downs of this extraordinary life, lived on the edge, lived at full stretch. Don't miss it.

Paul's most recent accolade is as Dave Hill in Stephen Spielberg's film 'Warhorse'.
